00.15 – 00.29	Impressions Davos, Switzerland	Davos, Switzerland, minus 20 degrees. The ice stadium here is named after a heating manufacturer making it heart warming for skaters and spectators alike at the Eisgala Davos.

00.50 – 00.59	ITV Robin Szolkowy (Germany)	<i>„It's just like a winter wonderland, mountains, the sunshine, the skiers, they all seem so relaxed, and the rink, the people. It's always great being back in Davos.“</i>
01.00 – 01.19	Davos Impressions	The world's elite figure skaters come together once a year in Europe's highest city for the Eisgala Davos. The result: top class sport, acrobatics and dance intermingled with a spectacular show in the midst of the romantic snow covered mountains of the Grisons.
01.20 – 02.35	Best of (Volosozhar/Trankov, Stéphane Lambiel, Ilinykh/Katsalapov, Miki Ando, Sarah Meier)	
02.36 - 02.48		The local Swiss matadors Sarah Meier and Stéphane Lambiel – she is the European Champion, he is a two-time World Champion – wow the crowds in Davos with very different elements.
02.49 – 03.30	Sarah Meier, 2011 European champion, European silver medalist and an eight-time Swiss national champion performing to „At Last“ song	The 27-year old Meier with her sassiness and amazing dance moves and Lambiel with his world class freestyle program to Giuseppe Verdi's Rigoletto.
03.31 – 03.54	ITV Stéphane Lambiel (Switzerland), two-time World Champion	<i>"We still want to show off difficult, technical elements, but it is also a show and you have to add emotion. I think it's easier to bring in these emotions in a show since we don't have the pressure to win a medal or earn points. It's just about your performance and that's what's great about the show, just skating for the audience.“</i>

03.55 – 04.18	Performance Sarah Meier (Switzerland), 2011 European Champion	Sarah Meier crowned her career in 2011 by winning gold at the European Championships. Today, nearly one year after retiring from competitive sport, shows such as the Eisgala Davos are the ideal platform for the 27 year-old to continue skating at a high level, but minus the competitive pressure.
04.19 – 04.44	ITV Sarah Meier (Switzerland), 2011 European Champion	<i>"For me this is really the perfect alternative – not just to stay in shape – of course I try to stay in shape with my training so that I can skate in these shows. And for the shows I still face the challenge of showing the audience what I can do. I still practice on the ice, but even so training is not as intensive as it was for competitions, also for my body because I had a lot of injuries. It's really the perfect mix."</i>
04.45 – 05.35	Impressions Miki Ando (Japan), two-time World Champion	
05.36 – 05.57	ITV Miki Ando (Japan), two-time World Champion	<i>"This is my first time to take a year off and just concentrate on the shows and enjoy showing myself internationally. And this show, to come from Art on Ice to Davos, it's the first time for me, which was my dream, so one of my dreams came true."</i>
05.58 – 06.48	Best impressions	The stars also had a lot on offer off the ice as well from the nightcap at the Steigenberger Grandhotel Belvédère to the horse-drawn carriage ride through snow-covered Davos. The skaters from around the world enjoyed the glistening winter world of Davos-Klosters to the fullest. And before going back to the ice in the evening two-time World Champion and Olympic silver medalist Stéphane Lambiel shared his know-how as well as tips and tricks with enthusiastic youngsters at the open air ice rink in Davos.
06.49 – 07.04		The combination of these types of side events with top-notch sport and the whole thing wrapped up in the alpine winter wonderland of the Davos-Klosters region, is what makes the Eisgala Davos alluringly different for both the audiences and the skaters.
07.05 – 07.22	ITV Georg Gasser (Organizer)	<i>"We always look out for who is the best in the world at the moment. So we don't merely focus on names that have a ring to them, but rather look at who was in absolute top form at the most recent international competitions and we send out our invitations accordingly."</i>

07.23 – 08.16	Impressions Elizaveta Tuktamysheva 2012 Youth Olympics champion, 2011 World Junior silver medalist, 2010 Junior Grand Prix Final silver medalist, a three-time senior Russian Nationals medalist, and 2011 Russian Junior champion	One of the skaters who belongs to this group is the first 15 year-old Russian Elizaveta Tuktamysheva. Just a few short weeks ago she won at the Junior Olympic Games in Innsbruck and in Davos she impressed the discerning crowds with her presence and expressiveness. In her home country she is considered a hot candidate for the 2014 Olympic Winter Games in Sotschi.
08.17 – 08.54		From the classic to modern pop hits. Musically the Eisgala Davos also covers a broad range.
08.55 – 09.06	Impressions Swan Lake Ballet Besedin/Polishchuk	And for laughs on the ice Russian ice acrobats Vladimir Besedin and Oleksey Polishchuk took care of that with their parody of Tchaikovsky's Swan Lake ballet.
09.07 – 09.22		On the two performance nights nearly 9000 spectators got a taste of the spectacular shows and they thanked the figure skating stars with thundering applause.
